

Professor Weil's course is exactly what it professes to be—a look at the high points. What an examination it is, though! Weil clearly loves Russia and her literature. From Pushkin to Solzhenitsyn, he examines the major authors, quoting liberally in Russian and English to give a flavor for the texts. His lectures on Pasternak are especially rich. The Pasternak we know as poet and novelist also translated five Shakespearean tragedies. Weil reads most movingly from these translations, even singing beautifully various songs from Hamlet and Othello. If you love Russian literature, this is the place to taste its wealth, beauty, and scope. For a complete package, The Teaching Company also provides helpful outlines of the lectures with complete written transcripts for reference. P.E.F.

#### **FIASCO: The American Military** Adventure in Iraq Thomas E. Ricks Read by James Lurie



James Lurie read it. Ricks's exposé on the invasion and botched occupation of Iraq is grim enough, so there is no need for a reader with a voice so gravelly and droning that the end result is like a funeral dirge. A listener may have the urge to shout,

"Clear your throat!" after listening for a couple hours. Also, expect to ride the volume control in a car since Lurie's voice does not cut clearly through road noise. To his credit, Lurie pronounces names correctly and keeps a steady pace, but overall this audiobook is not up to the high standards of Ricks's writing and research. T.F.

#### **KEYBOARD CONVERSATIONS:** The Romanticism of the Russian Soul Jeffrey Siegel Read by Jeffrey Siegel



The result is a pleasant education, one that even those of us who are musically dim can follow.
